

CD Review - JOHN CODY CARTER - Don't You Think It's Time

Don't You Think It's Time

Yell Records

(14 Selections – Playing Time 42:11)

John Cody Carter has paid his dues touring with the late Johnny Paycheck, writing songs with his mentor Hank Cochran, having one of his tunes (When It Rains It Pours) recorded by none other than Merle Haggard, appearing with Haggard on the Austin City Limits TV series; performing with Willie Nelson in the movie Tales Out Of Luck... and a bunch more credits. It's surprising he's found the time to cut this album.

All but two of the songs here are written or co-written by John Cody Carter, several are collaborations with the legendary Hank Cochran. There's a distinct 'Bakersfield' sound to a lot of the material, and indeed John Cody Carter's vocal style has inflections of Merle Haggard. It's pretty much a 'can't miss' affair.

The key tracks here are those with the 'Bakersfield' touch in them. Tunes like You're Just Leaving Out The Leaving, the lead single Let's Stop Right Where We Are, The American Way (co-written by Carter with the late Sam Hogin); and the natural, I Gotta Find Buck Down In Bakersfield, are all winners. The best bet for a real hit record here comes in the Haggard-ish Don't Walk Out On Me; challenged for top-spot on the album by the country blues tune It's A Good Thing.

The two songs not written by John Cody Carter include a cover of the Don Williams tune Don't You Think It's Time taken from Williams' 1975 Harmony album; and You Don't Love Me Anymore a Freddy Powers tune previously cut by Merle Haggard.

Canadian (CCMA) All-Star Band alumni Steve Piticco (guitar) and Don Reed (fiddle), are featured session players on this album. Both musicians are also part of the *John Cody Carter & The Double Down Ranch Band*, in support of Carter's U.S. and Canadian tour dates.
